Oral and written class tests are also held on regular basis to monitor the students progression. Students of the 1st year are taken to the library reading room by the concerned teachers to familiarise them with the question pattern from the previous question papers and question banks available in the library. The college has an active career counselling committee headed by a senior teacher of the college. This committee is actively involved with the students in guiding and mentoring them to make them ready for the challenges of the future. Local people of eminence are invited to deliver special talks for proper guidance to the students.

The institution regularly conducts various internal examination system. Class tests mainly monthly test are taken by individual departments and the marks are displayed in the departmental notice boards. Sent-up examinations or selection tests are conducted for examining the students ability to sit for the university examinations. University examination rules are simulated for the internal examinations too. Students attendance in the class as well as in such conducted tests are important criteria for the students to qualify for the university examinations. Students who do not perform fairly in the examinations are required to meet the principal with their parents/guardians. The students are are also required to give an undertaking pledge to improve their performance in the next such examinations failing which they will be debarred from appearing in the University Examinations.

The academic calendar is prepared at the beginning of every academic session. The different sub committees of the teachers council prepare their individual programme calendar and submit it to the IQAC. Kurseong College was established in the year 1967 on the foothills of Kurseong Sub-division of Darjeeling District, under West Bengal. It is initiated by the local enthusiasts and few educationalists to impart a good education to the students hailing from a humble background. The place is dwelt with tea garden workers, job class population and self support business or home tourism in some cases. Nepali language is the lingua franca and the Nepali language and literature is the prominent medium of social expression and participations. 8. Future Plans of Actions for Next Academic Year

The colleges are the higher educational institutions and have to be very dynamic and susceptible to changes.
