The university incorporates faculty members from different colleges affiliated to it to prepare the syllabi, modules, course design etc. The faculty members from Kurseong college participate in these processes which helps the college to plan curriculum delivery in an appropriate and student friendly design. Students who do not perform fairly in the examinations are required to meet the principal with their parents/guardians. The students are also required to give an undertaking pledge to improve their performance in the next such examinations failing which they will be debarred from appearing in the University Examinations.
